FINDING FAITH BEHIND THE STORIES

Have you ever played the small talk game: If you could have dinner with one person, alive or dead, who would it be? An icebreaker meant to stimulate conversation and connection, it's a way to know someone through others—those they admire or find interesting. Folks' answers to this question

often says more about them than their imagined dinner guest. What questions might you ask this person?

It's a way to play the "who do you know" network game a bit in reverse. Who do you wish you knew, and why? What kind of traits do you admire in their life? What lessons might you learn over the conversation with one another? The pastor in me wonders, how did they find God in their lives?

As a newbie to Vinje, I am struck by your incredible worship space. The Holy Spirit moving through the stained glass enclosing the space is a powerful reminder of God's peace and presence. Meanwhile we are circled and held by such a great cloud of witnesses; saints who have modeled and lived the faith in a diversity of ways in their lifetime. It is a beautiful visual reminder about the strength of this legacy of faith which we share and which we participate in every day.

What I find myself wondering about: what about the folks who are not listed? While I would love to have dinner someday with modern theologians like Deitrich Bonhoeffer, historic saints like Francis of Assisi, or even a few biblical heroes like Ruth or Esther; would they be the first saint I would want to ask about their faith? What about the saints we don't think about as readily, or ones who have lived more recently? I find myself most curious about those whose faith was motivating force of their lives, but it is not necessarily the primary part of their historical legacy. What about their stories?


These folks are saints. The named ones circling the sanctuary have lived lives of faith worth emulating and learning about. But you're a saint too. Every day you live your faith in real ways by the how you serve others, through your kindness, through your compassion and expressions of grace. Your life tells about the goodness of God. Some saints live their faith louder than others -- in obvious ways, in famous and glorious ways. But most saints I know live their faith in quiet, faithful, impactful, grace-filled ways. And both of those stories would make interesting dinner conversation.

Our brave, intrepid preachers answered this brief: who would you like to ask about how they lived a life of faith? We invite you to hear stories of "Everyday Saints" in our Wednesday night worship through them month of February. Hear our preachers tell

tales about the faith fueling the public lives of Rosa Parks, Mr. Fred Rogers, and Laura Ingalls Wilder. We hope to inspire you, as an Everyday Saint, to ask questions about how your faith authors, guides, and testifies in your daily life.

Stay warm, friends, the February prairie winds are strong. May you live your faith these days with boldness and in grace.

This month, pastor Andrés asked Mary Rinke to share her memories of Rose Mary Ulland, Director of Educational Ministries.

Many people have had a person in their lives that has touched their hearts and minds and helped them grow in their faith in some times, the most unexpected ways. Rose Mary was that person for many of us the "older crowd" of the Vinje family.



She was a living example of what faith looked like in thoughts, words and deeds. Her artwork, cards and banners graced many of our lives. The gentle, powerful and deep words of her prayers/ devotions/messages were inclusive, accepting and non judgmental as was her way of treating everyone she met.

Rose Mary's influence was an integral part of Vinje's Library development, organization and expansion to better serve every age group while learning and exploring the wonder of God's promise. Many members of Vinje were encouraged to work diligently to provide an array of books, puppets and things that would further our congregations' faith.

Some phrases you'd hear from Rose Mary: "Have you thought of this in a different way?" Say "Tug of Peace" not "Tug of War"; There was always an underlying theme of: "There's beauty in everything." Her quiet, gentle way of encouraging our hidden/known talents helped us grow into the people we are today and we'll remain forever grateful for her guidance and support.

Teaching and taking classes at Holden Village in Chelan, WA was dear to Rose Mary's heart. Whatever she was teaching/learning she brought it back to us in a blessed fashion. She had her knowing smile and musical laugh when she talked about the "Founding Mothers" of Holden Village. Her sense of humor and the joy of her conversations are genuinely missed.

The reach of Rose Mary's light was far and wide. Her funeral was filled with extended family and friends from across the nation speaking of her presence and influence in their lives. It was said by those that attended, that her internment had an electric feeling.

As a memory keeper, I wanted to celebrate and honor Rose Mary's life and legacy. One of the sayings on her art studio's door was written in German and translated to" Where your heart is, there is your God. Rose Mary's heart was that of a good and faithful servant. A true blessing to all that had the privilege of knowing her. She will always be fondly remembered as part of Vinje's family history.
